

## HTS Codes vs HS Codes: What's the difference and how-to find yours

As of February 2025, all shipments with a Country of Origin of China or Hong Kong that are destined for the U.S. must include an HTS code for border clearance.

HS Codes are different from HTS Codes. The **Harmonized System** (HS) is an internationally recognized system for categorizing goods.

The **Harmonized Tariff Schedule** (HTS) is specific to goods being **imported into the U.S.** and it extends the HS Code to a more detailed 10-digit level.

The first 6 digits of an HTS code are identical to the corresponding HS code.

6+ digits for each item in your shipment	<ul> <li>10 digits for each item in your shipment.</li> </ul>

## Tools to find HS and HTS Codes

- <u>Harmonized Tariff Schedule</u> (HTS) Code (U.S. International Trade Commission)
- <u>CROSS</u> (Customs Rulings Online Search System (https://rulings.cbp.gov/)
- <u>Tariff Finder</u> (Canadian resource for HTS and HS codes)
  - You may need to expand the subheader in order to see the 10 digit HTS code.
- <u>Canada Post Find a Harmonized System Code</u> (HS and HTS codes)
  - You will have to add the country of origin in order to find the HTS code after obtaining the HS code.
