U.S. CONSUMER PRODUCTS SAFETY COMMISSION (CPSC)

The CPSC is the U.S. agency responsible for enforcing consumer product safety regulations.

- Federal law requires manufacturers and importers of consumer products to test and certify compliance with applicable safety rules.

Proof of compliance was often only requested when needed.

WHAT'S CHANGING?

Starting July 8, 2026, certificate information for applicable products must be submitted electronically at the time of import.



Working on solutions with US CBP & our broker to submit documents required.

CURRENTLY WITH CHIT CHATS

Certain HTS codes were temporarily restricted, have been re-enabled.

TIMELINE

June

CPSC will require **electronic submission** of Certificate of Conformity information for applicable products entering the United States.

- June 30: Restricted HTS codes on Chit Chats
- July 3: CC Intl Tracked option

July 7 (CSMS #69152556)

- Existing certificate obligations did not change—only the method of submitting them electronically changed.

July 8 ([CSMS #69152556](#))

- Mandatory enforcement begins
- Shipments wouldn't be automatically rejected

DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED

Products regulated by CPSC may require:

- Children's Product Certificate (CPC) or
- General Certificate of Conformity (GCC)

Containing product IDs, manufacturing dates,
and testing records

COMMON CONCERNS

My goods are not intended for children? Why was I being restricted?

- Potential Automatic Rejection
- Solution in the works
- How to disclaim intended use
 - May still require a [GCC \(General Certificate of Conformity\)](#)

COMMON CONCERNS

Assembled from pieces sourced by various manufacturers: will documentation be required for all individual components, or just the finished piece?

- Classification is always based on the finished product

COMMON CONCERNS

Resellers - does this apply to goods that are resold?

- Resellers are not required to have testing information on products but disclaim code required
 - Refer to [CPSC Resellers Guide](#)

COMMON CONCERNS

Small Batch Manufacturers

- May be exempt from 3rd Party Testing
- Less than 7500 units/\$1.48 MM revenue previous calendar year
- Investigating how clients can register and how it applies to CPSC eFiling requirements

NEXT STEPS

- Solutions being worked on how to remit necessary documents
- U.S. CBP scrutiny - our team is closely monitoring
- Ensure proper certifications available
- Review HTS codes to ensure using most suited to your products
